### Introduction

Our lives are inextricably connected with the ocean. It regulates our climate and weather, generates approximately half of the planet's oxygen, and provides food and livelihoods for billions of people worldwide. Yet the health of the ocean is under threat. The impacts of greenhouse gas emissions, including ocean warming and acidification, make it clear that the climate crisis is an ocean crisis. At the same time, other human activities, such as overfishing and plastic pollution, are harming ocean ecosystems and communities around the globe.

The seventh Our Ocean Conference—co-hosted by the Republic of Palau and the United States in Koror, Palau—focused on six thematic areas: climate change, sustainable fisheries, sustainable blue economies, marine protected areas, maritime security, and marine pollution. The importance of ocean-based climate solutions and the importance of a healthy ocean to Small Island Developing States and all communities where the ocean is a primary source of sustenance were cross-cutting themes.

This was the first Our Ocean Conference to be held in a Small Island Developing State. Titled "Our Ocean, Our People, Our Prosperity," the conference brought together governments and non-state actors to make concrete commitments to protect ocean health and security. The conference closed with more than 410 commitments worth approximately \$16.35 billion. Since the Our Ocean Conferences began in 2014, they have now resulted in more than 1,800 commitments worth nearly \$108 billion.

This paper presents the commitments for the seventh Our Ocean Conference organized by thematic area. In addition, there are two commitments related to future Our Ocean Conferences: the commitment of Panama to host the eighth Our Ocean Conference in 2023 and the commitment of the seventh Our Ocean Conference youth delegation to form a task force of previous youth delegates to facilitate further integration of young people.











### Worth a total of: \$4.9 billion

The seventh Our Ocean Conference highlighted the ocean-climate nexus and the role of ocean-based climate solutions – including shipping decarbonization, marine nature-based solutions, and offshore renewable energy – in keeping the 1.5°C goal within reach or improving global climate resilience. As the ocean-climate nexus was a cross-cutting theme of the conference, climate commitments appeared throughout the six sessions (see, for example, the sustainable blue economies section).

Worth a total of: \$668 billion

The sustainable fisheries session underscored issues including the contribution of fisheries to food security, the importance of considering labor conditions in the fisheries value chain, and the need to address illegal, unreported, and unregulated (IUU) fishing. Announcements that committed new resources to the fight against IUU fishing, for example, included a strong suite of commitments on policy, governance, technical assistance, and monitoring and traceability initiatives.

Worth a total of: \$5.7 billion

Sustainable blue economies advance ocean health alongside economic prosperity, providing sustainable food, power, and transportation. At the seventh Our Ocean Conference, the United States, Denmark, and the Marshall Islands, for example, announced the number of signatories to the Declaration on Zero Emission Shipping by 2050 had more than doubled since COP26. Meanwhile, countries including the UK, Norway, Belgium, and Sri Lanka made offshore renewable energy announcements that will add approximately 30 gigawatts of capacity by 2030.
